Certificate of Need The Pines at Rutland Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation

Dear Ms. Jerry:

This firm represents National Health Care Associates, Inc. (NHCA). NHCA will be filing an application for a Certificate of Need for a proposed expenditure to undertake renovations at The Pines at Rutland Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation. NHCA acknowledges that the Green Mountain Care Board has statutory jurisdiction over this project, under 18 V.S.A. § 9434. We are writing to provide the Board with preliminary information to commence the CON process. We anticipate that this will be a standard CON application.

Equipment to be purchased and/or replaced: Other than the possibility of installing a new emergency generator (which is included in the project costs), NHCA will not be purchasing equipment. Instead, NHCA will be purchasing furnishings, such as chairs and tables for the dining and recreation rooms and new mattresses and furniture for resident rooms.

Approximate square feet of construction/renovation:

23,384 square feet to be renovated. Renovations will consist of replacing wall coverings, floors, etc. Nurses stations will be replaced and storage closets for oxygen tanks will be created. Some partitions will be created in resident bedrooms to offer more privacy to individual residents.

Approximate project cost (to be finalized and detailed in the application): \$3.5 Million Dollars

Financing: Banking institution to be determined and disclosed in application

Objective to be achieved: Modernize the facility for improved resident experience and quality of care

Anticipated impact on health care costs, access and quality: There will be no impact on costs and access, but this project is intended to improve quality.

Estimated beginning and completion dates: The beginning date is contingent upon the receipt of a Certificate of Need. It is anticipated that construction would take approximately one-year from start to finish. With proper notice, the residents will be relocated within the facility while their rooms undergo upgrades. Subject to adjustment, NCHA plans on performing the renovations in 10 phases, 5 per floor. Patient safety is paramount.

Please let me know if there is anything more the board needs to determine what NHCA should provide and address in its application.
