We are writing to request a Jurisdictional determination for the following project:

We are proposing to create a medical clinic at Lincoln Peak at the Sugarbush Resort in Warren, Vermont. The Three Peaks Medical Clinic will provide limited medical services to resort guests during weekends and holiday periods. This will equate to roughly 60 days of operation during the ski season. During this 60-day period, based on past records (from UVMMC) we expect to see roughly 400 patients 200 hundred of which will likely be knee related injuries. The medical clinic will also serve as a site to facilitate wilderness, emergency, and sports medicine related research studies.

The new medical clinic will be structured as a non-profit. The clinic will be a private physician lead practice and will be operated like an outpatient physician's office. The clinic will be staffed by volunteer physicians who are board certified in either Emergency Medicine or Orthopedics/ Sports Medicine. The primary goal of the facility will be to evaluate and treat on-hill injuries as well as basic walk-in primary care (sore throats, fever, cough). Patients with traumatic injuries meeting Trauma Center transfer criteria will be transported according to established pre-hospital guidelines in associating with Mad River Valley Ambulance. Physicians on site may assist in care of these patients prior to arrival of pre-hospital providers and will transfer care to EMS personnel per Sugarbush Ski Patrol protocol.

Physicians will all be volunteer, and a paper billing system will be used for point of service billing via credit card(square) for technical services only (x-ray, sutures, etc). All services provided will be on site. We have several local physicians who have committed to volunteering at our clinic. If the volunteers fall through, we may decide to postpone for another year. Upon completion of care patients will be provided with discharge instructions and copy of invoice with appropriate codes

for technical services so that they may file an insurance claim as needed. We will not be collecting or billing any insurance companies. All payment for technical services will be collected on site at time of service. Donations will be accepted for assessment and evaluation of illness or injury. All capital and supply procurement will be funded through donations from resort guests and local community members. All revenue generated through the clinic will be recycled into the clinic.

The X-Ray technician will be a paid position and will be funded through donations. If funds allow, an office manager will also be a paid position funded through donations.

Three Peaks Medical Clinic will provide malpractice insurance as needed on a shift-by-shift coverage plan. The clinic will be covered by liability, workers compensation and malpractice insurance.

We are currently in the process of filing our federal application for 501(c)3 status, creating bylaws and we have established a 3-member board of directors comprised of an executive director, a medical director and a third board member. All of these board positions are non-compensated positions at this point. We are currently registered as a business with the state of Vermont and have received our federal EIN number. We have created a website through which donations can be made, a fundraising committee (all volunteer), we have opened a bank account, Paypal account and a PO Box all in the name of Three Peaks Medical Clinic, Inc.

The medical clinic will be located at Sugarbush Resort at Lincoln Peak in a space that was previously used by the University of Vermont Medical Center to operate their satellite Orthopedic clinic. The UVMMC orthopedic clinic is no longer occupying this space and has no plan to return. The resort has offered to donate the space, rent free, provided our facility pay the utilities. Sugarbush Resort and Three Peaks Medical Clinic will have an operating agreement drafted regarding use of the Sugarbush facility.

UVMMC had been operating a medical facility at the Sugarbush Resort that was very similar to our proposed model for over 25 vears. In 2019, UVMMC decided to remove this facility from the resort. The UVMMC orthopedic clinic at Sugarbush treated 300-500 guests and local community members each year during their 6 months of operations. In the past, local community members, members of the Green Mountain Valley Racing Academy in Waitsfield, Vermont, resort guests and guests from Mad River Glen Ski Area relied on this facility to receive timely, high quality medical care during hours when most local facilities were not operating. The Mad River Valley Health Center, operated by UVMMC located 15 minutes from the resort, which is the closest medical facility, operates Monday through Friday. They are currently at or above their operational capacity. The next closest facility would be the Urgent Care Center in Berlin, Vermont which is 55 minutes from our proposed facility. The Three Peaks Medical Clinic will serve to provide local community members and guests with access timely medical care during operating hours that are not common to local medical facilities (weekends and holidays), it will also help to reduce the burden on the other local medical facilities which, in the coming years with the growing health care needs of the state, will be much needed. The founding members of the facility all have long term ties to and are invested in the local community. The founding members and the Sugarbush Resort have agreed that a non-profit model, over which local community members have control rather than a large hospital system such as UVMMC, will hopefully secure the facility's long term, consistent operation. As we have not had a medical facility at this location in two years, we are eager to open the Three Peaks Medical Clinic 12/15/22. This summer we decided to delay our opening this year due to the anticipated spike in COVID-19 cases and we found that we needed more time to prepare properly.
