I am a member of the Green Mountain Care Board (GMCB) and work as a clinical emergency physician at Central Vermont Medical Center (CVMC), a member hospital of the University of Vermont Health Network (UVMHN). The other member hospitals of UVMHN in Vermont are the University of Vermont Medical Center (UVMMC) and Porter Hospital (PH). I am employed by the UVMHN Medical Group, Inc., the governing organization for physicians who provide clinical services to UVMHN member hospitals. My spouse works as a clinical emergency physician at CVMC and in medical informatics at the UVMMC Emergency Department. As with other similarly situated physicians at CVMC, my spouse and I are eligible for incentive compensation, set by a standardized plan established annually by the UVMHN Medical Group board of directors. Neither my spouse nor I hold positions at UVMHN or its member hospitals related to budgeting, nor do we have a fiduciary duty of loyalty to these entities.

The GMCB is an independent board that consists of a chair and four members. One duty of the GMCB is to review and approve the budgets of Vermont hospitals. Though each hospital budget is considered independently, UVMHN participates in the presentation of all three budgets of its member hospitals. GMCB members are subject to specific conflict of interest rules at 18 V.S.A. § 9374(c). As members of an independent board appointed by the Governor, GMCB members are also "public servants" under the Code of Ethics. 3 V.S.A. § 1202.

The Ethics Commission concluded a reasonable individual with knowledge of the relevant facts would not find that an appearance of a conflict exists. However, the Ethics Commission encouraged me to file this disclosure statement to publicly disclose the relevant facts that a reasonable person would rely upon, as described above. Finally, the Ethics Commission concluded that if the appearance of a conflict did exist, I would have good cause to proceed because the conflict is "de minimis" or speculative in nature. With respect to the GMCB-specific conflict of interest rule, my employment relationship with UVMHN and its member hospitals is specifically permitted by 18 V.S.A. § 9374(c)(1) and de minimis and speculative interests are not disqualifying under 18 V.S.A. § 9374(c)(2).
