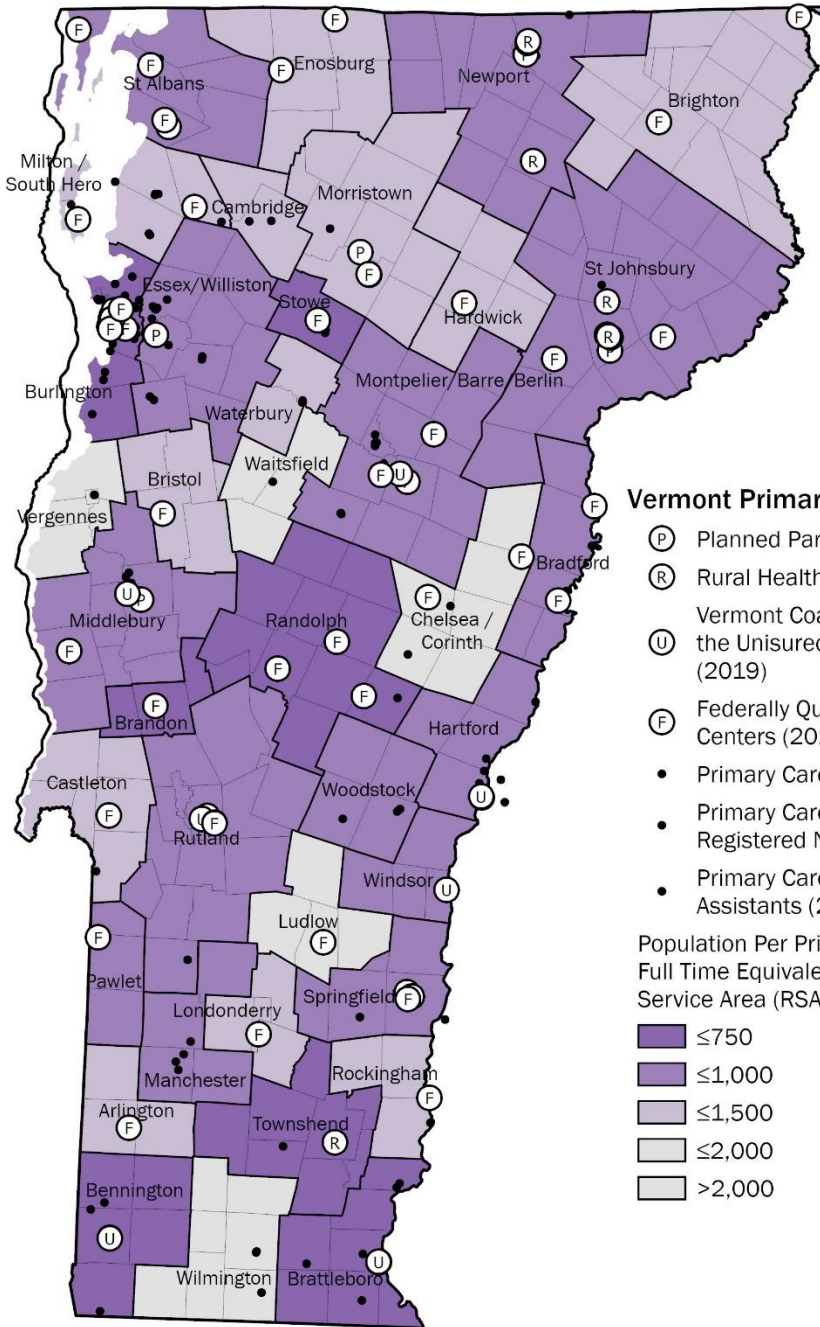

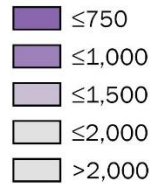

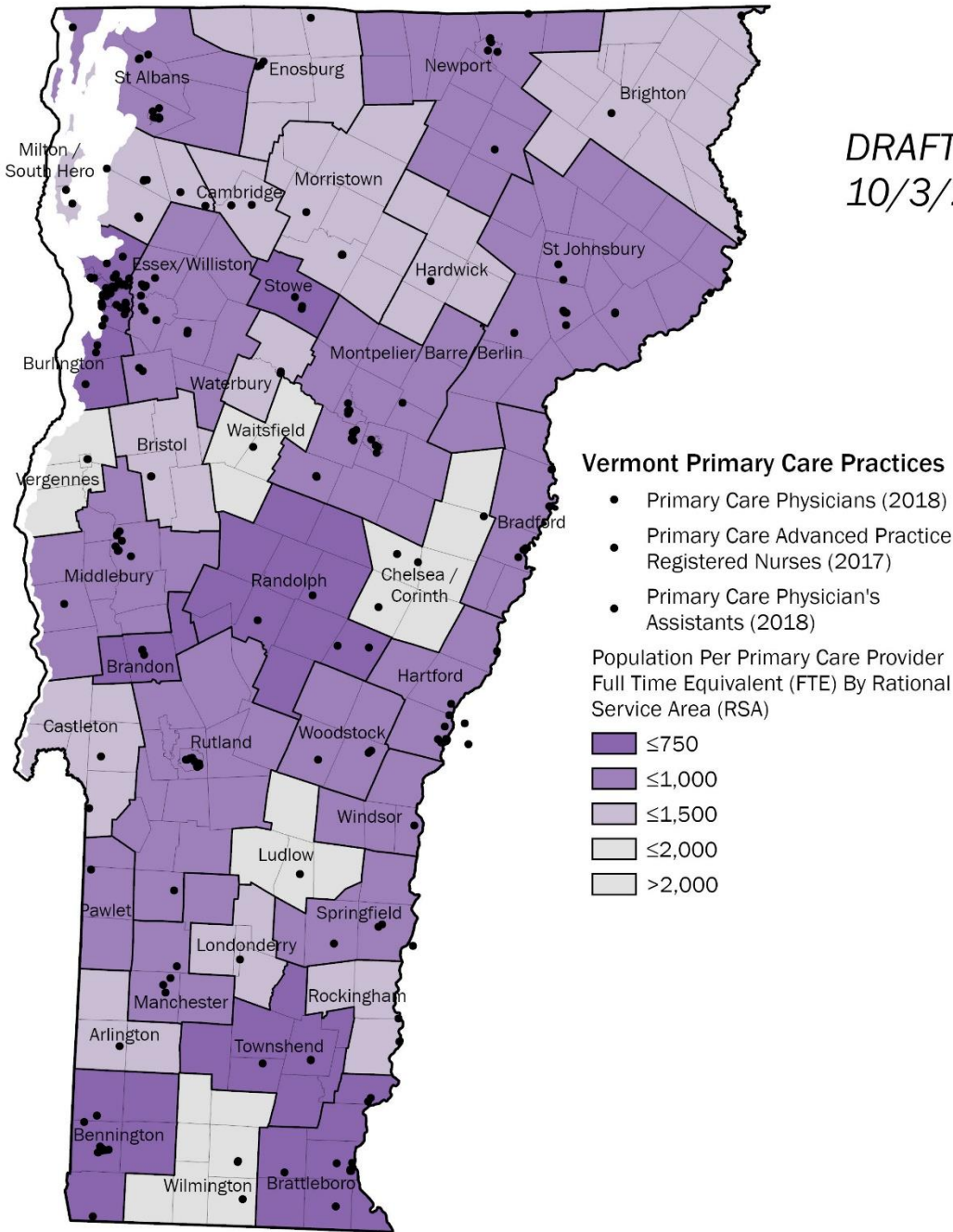

Population Per Primary Care Provider Full Time Equivalent (FTE) By Rational Service Area (RSA)



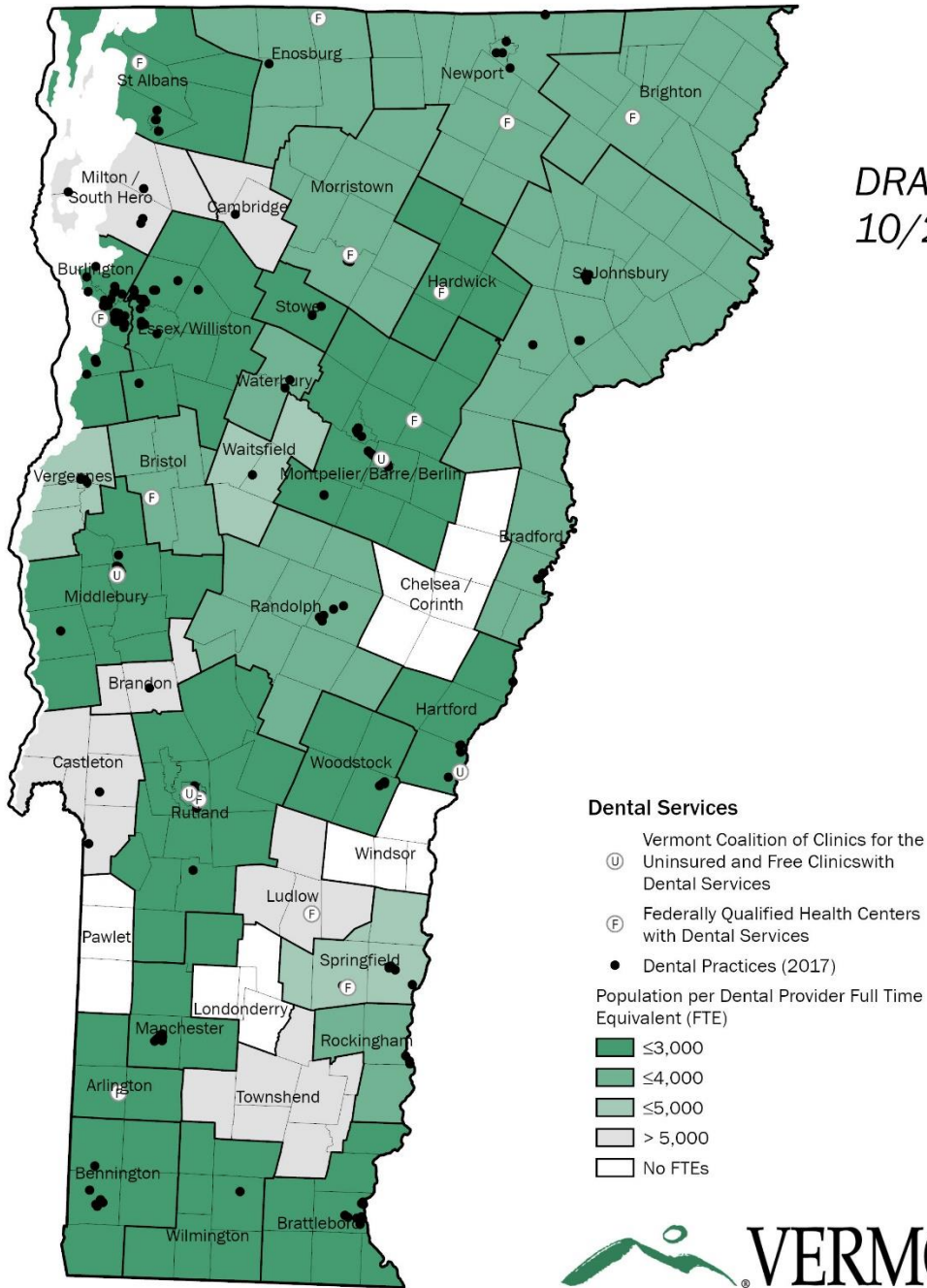

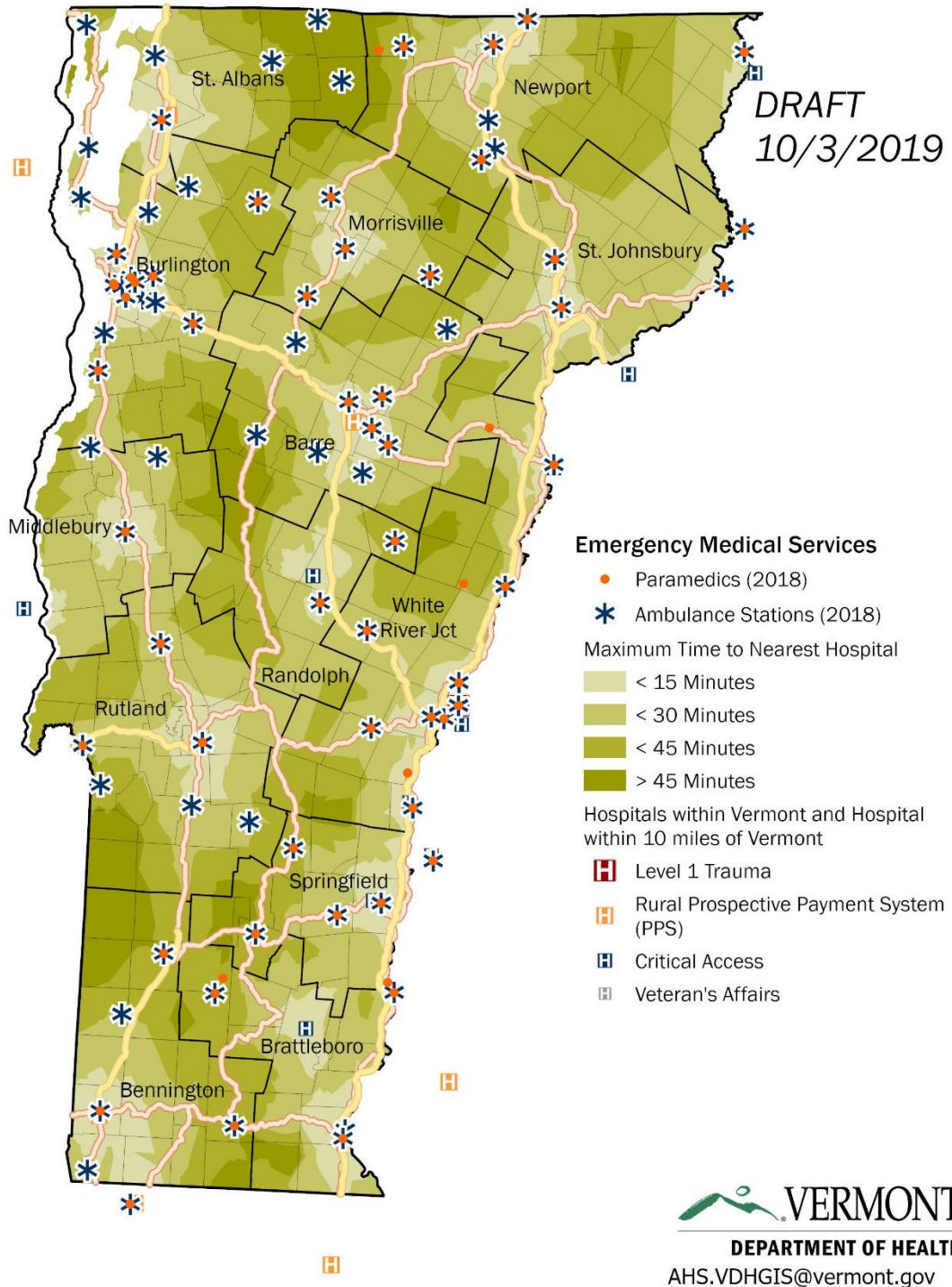

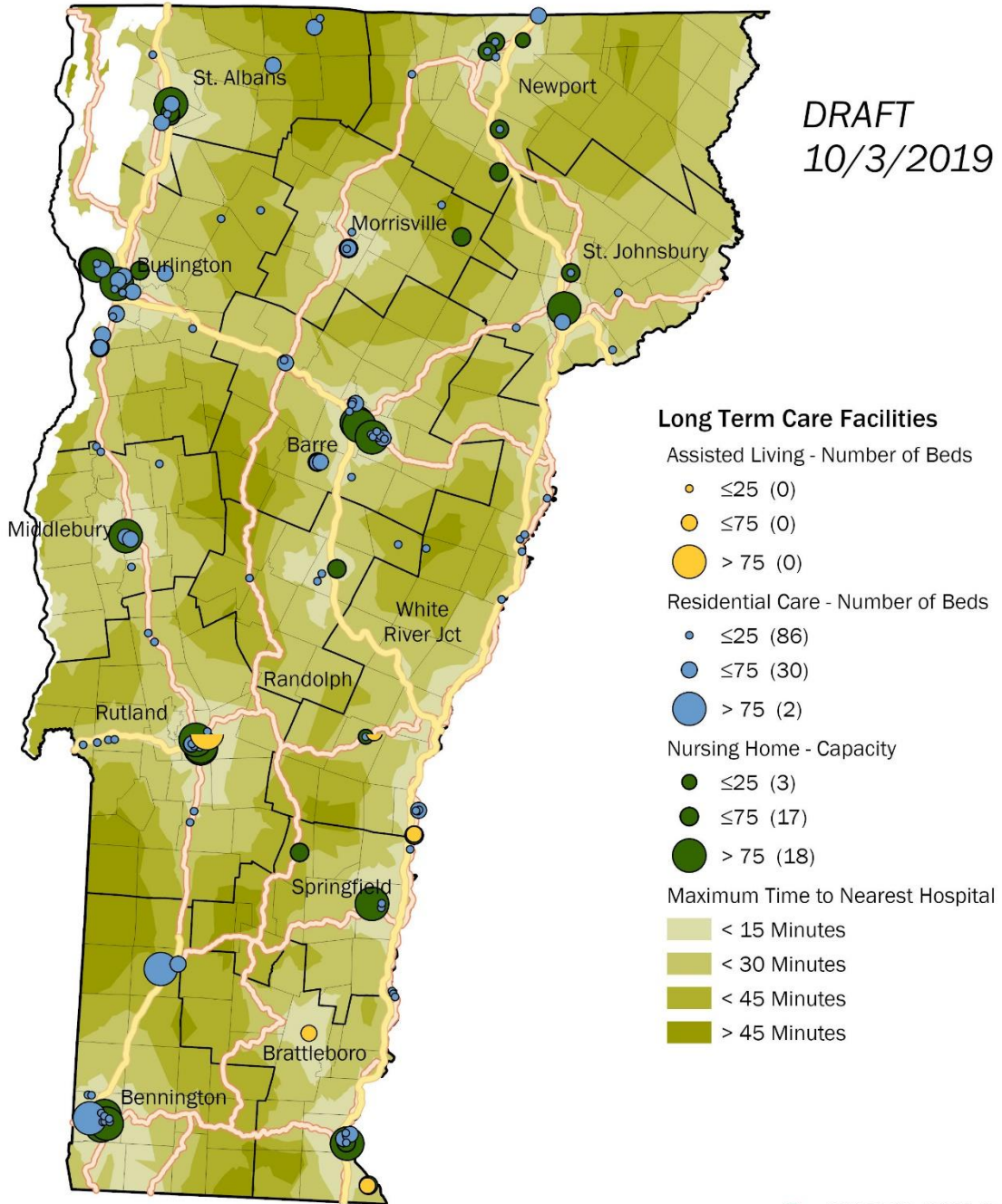

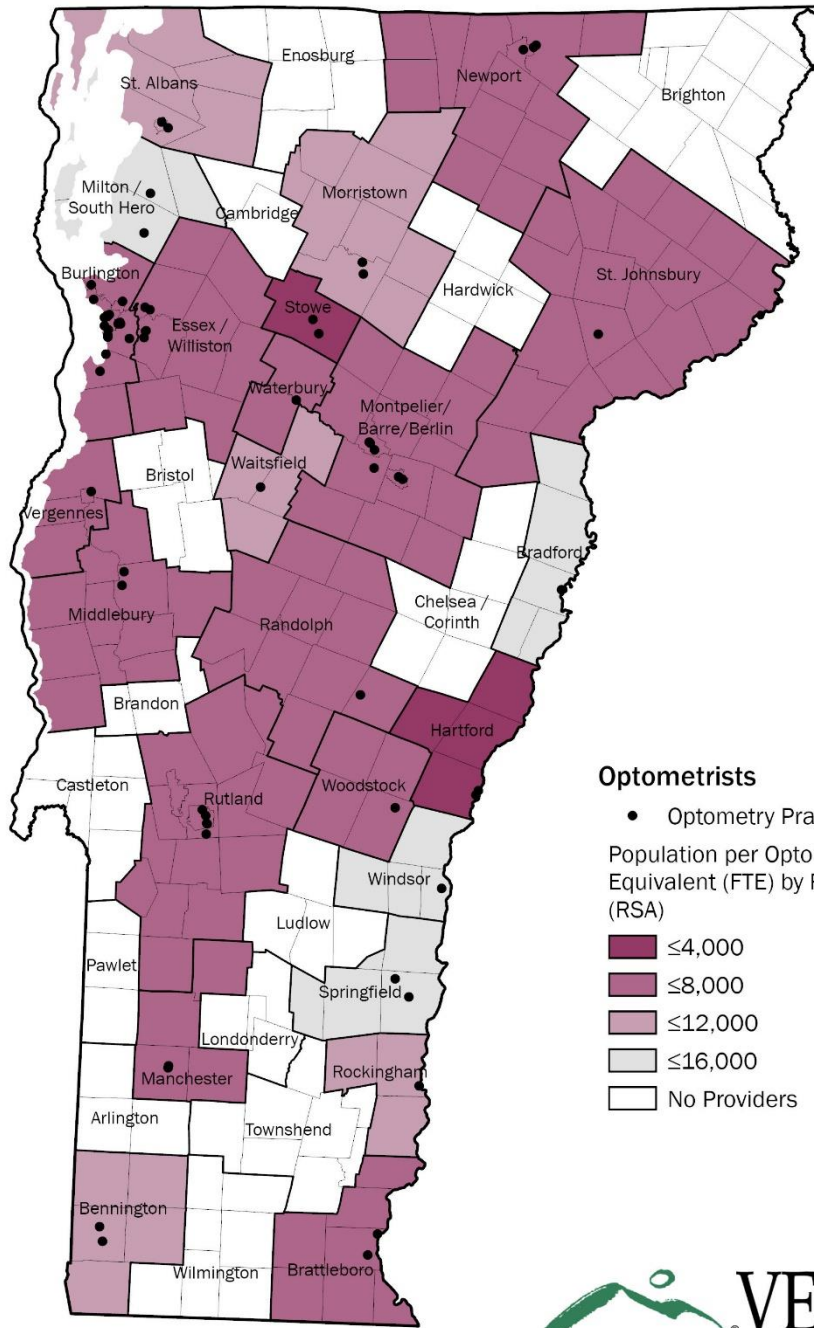

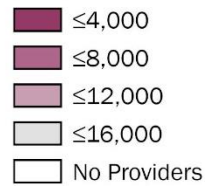

Population per Optometrist Full Time Equivalent (FTE) by Rational Service Area (RSA)

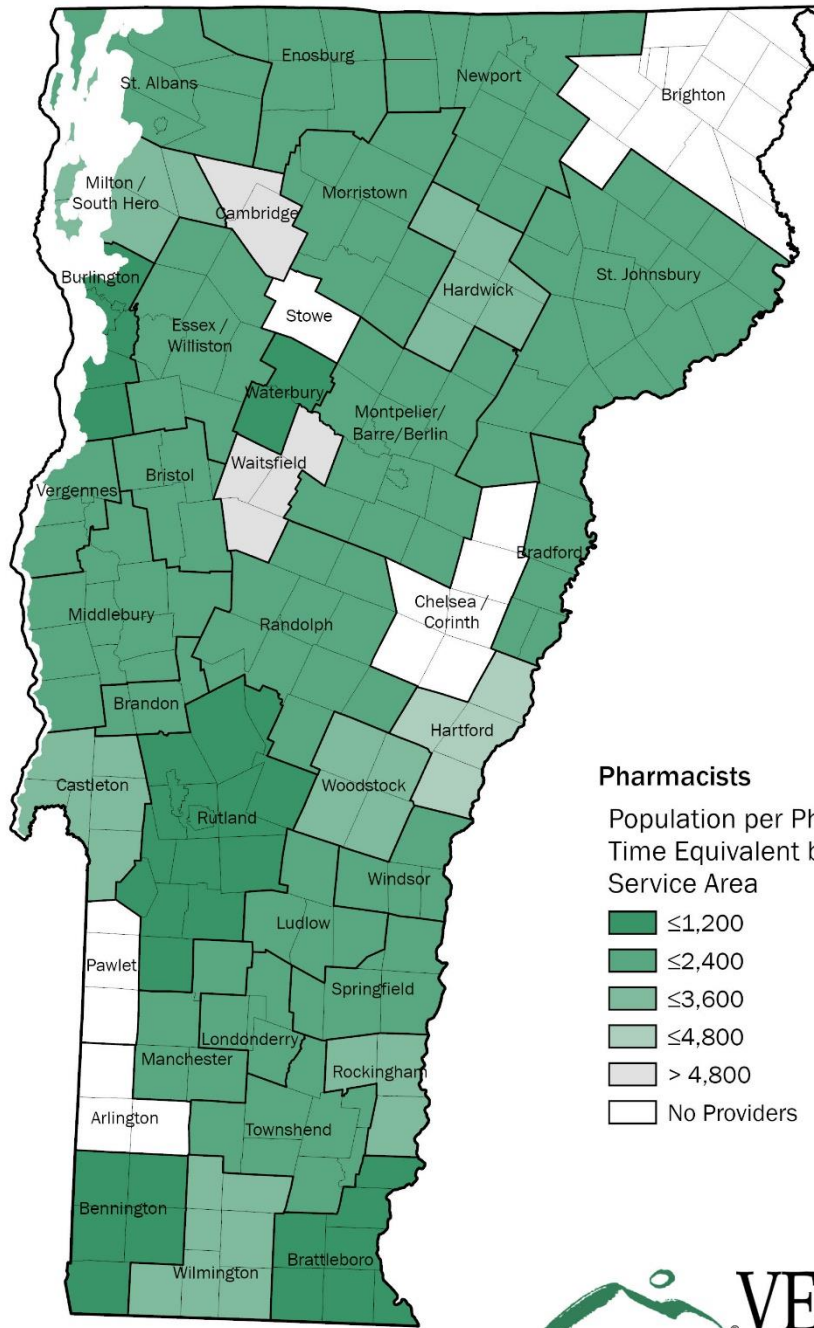

Population per Pharmacist Full Time Equivalent by Rational Service Area

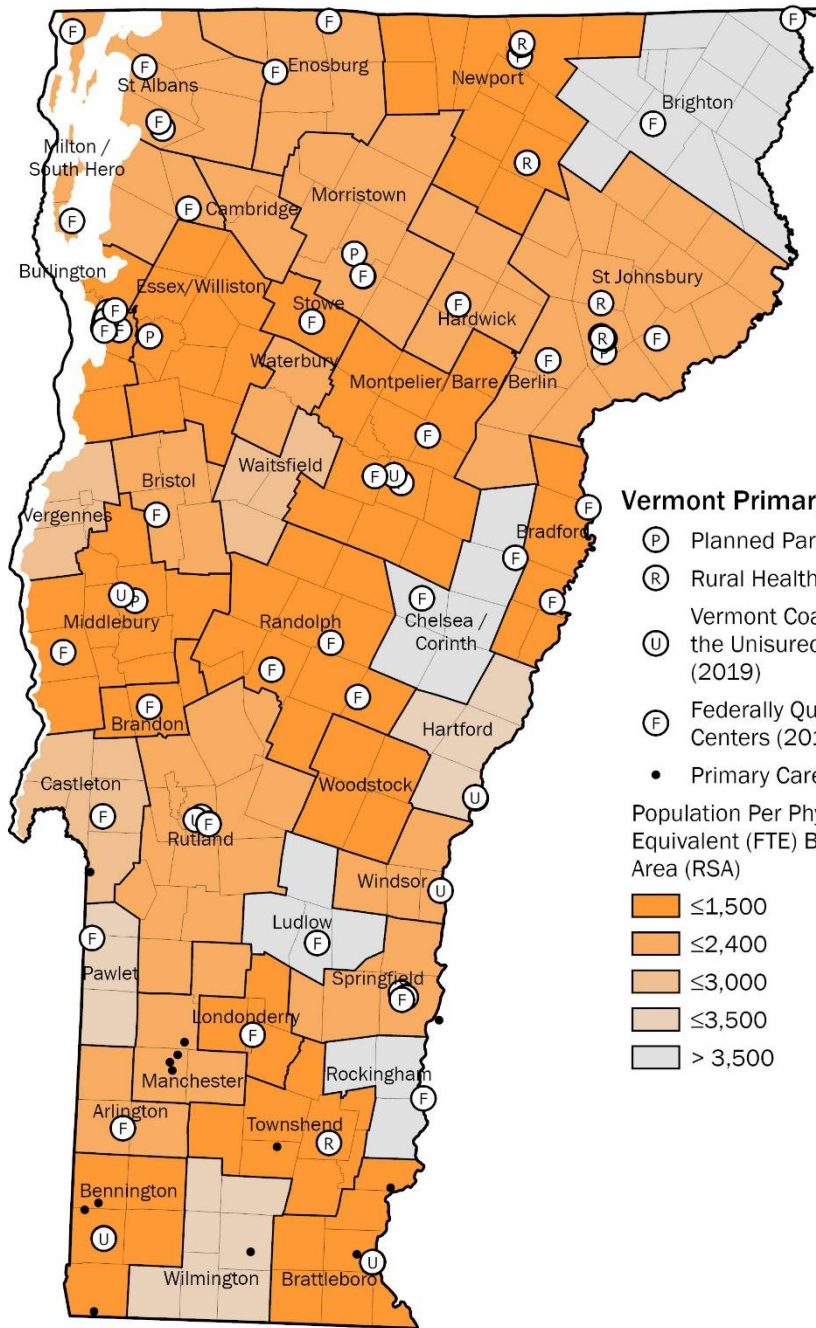

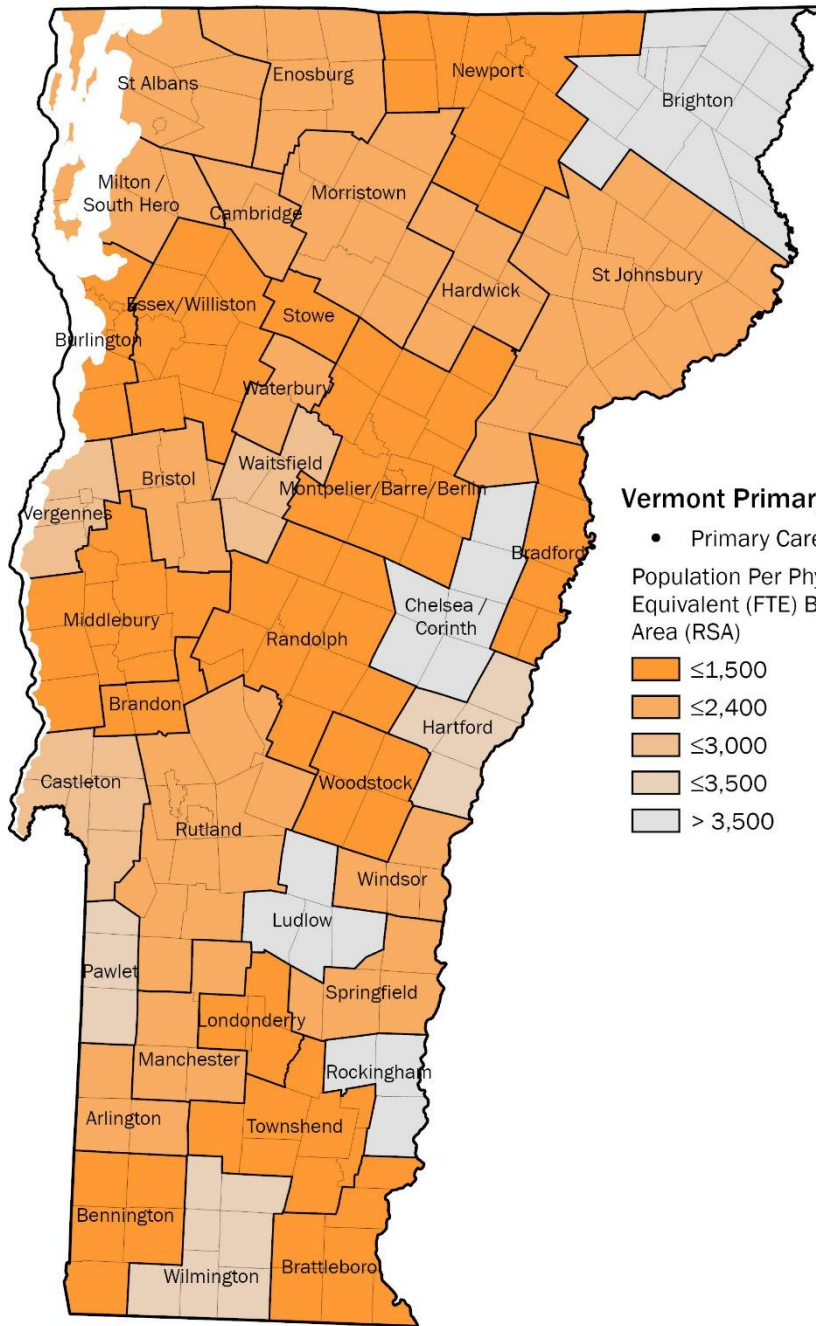

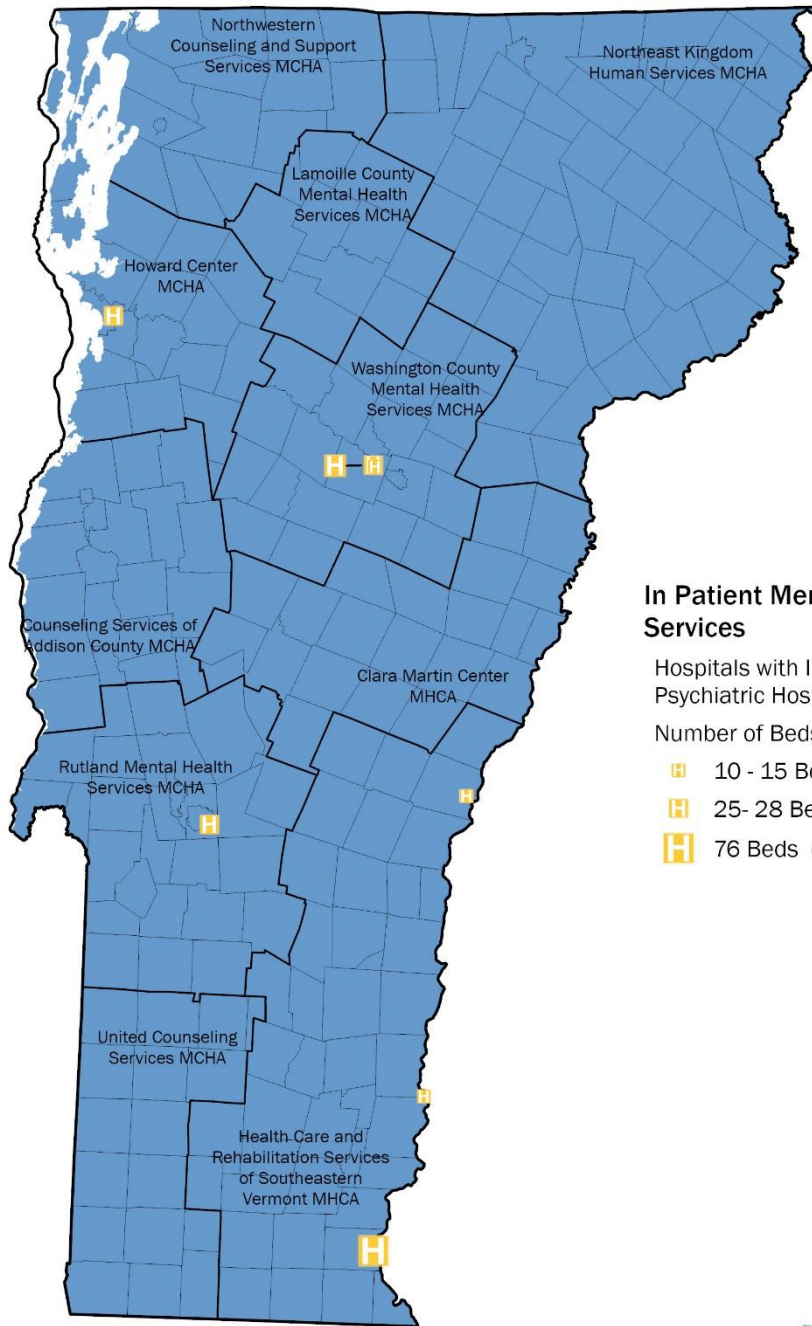

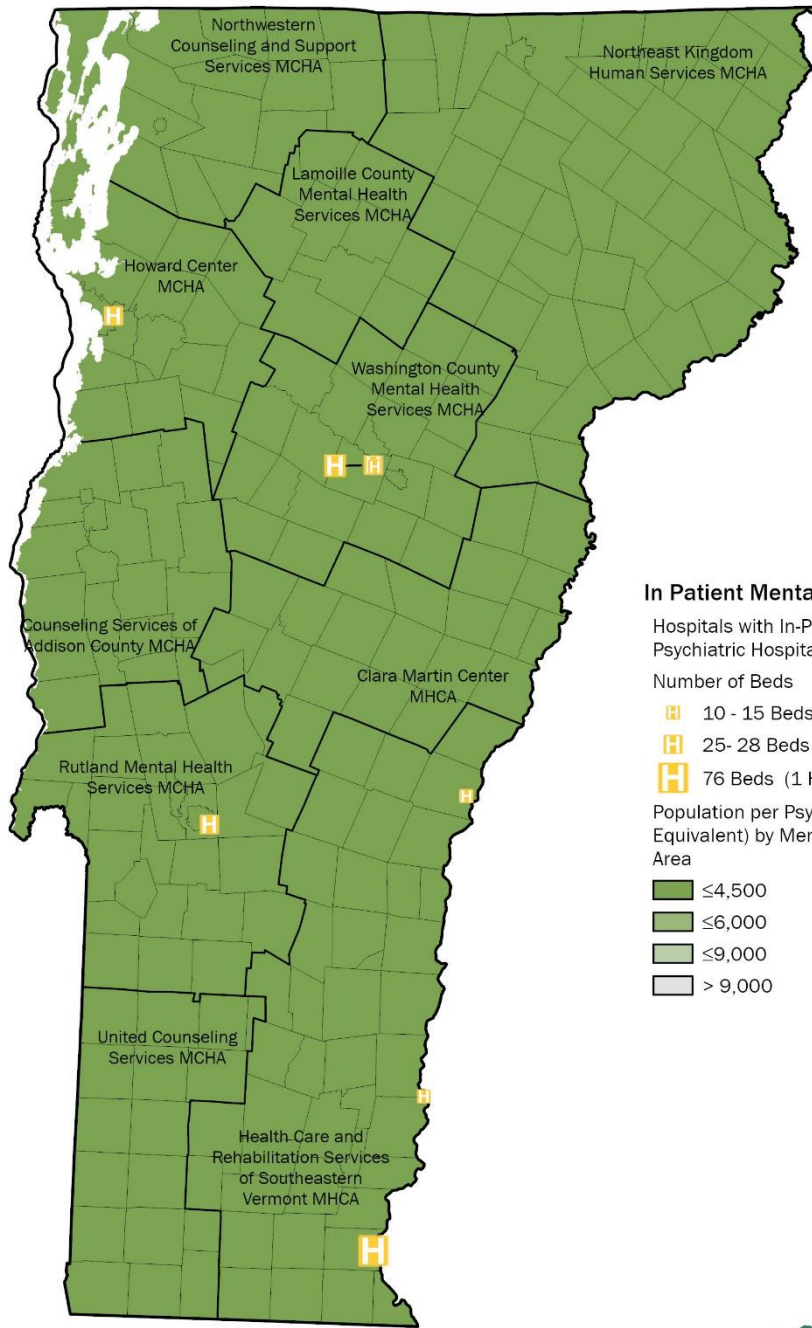
