Recently, I learned that the GMCB is considering cutting the funding for the RCR role. I realize that I am biased being in this role, but I thought it might be helpful to share my perspective as you deliberate on this matter. In my role as RCR I meet with practices to review their quality metrics data and support them in performance improvement efforts. I see this role as part clinical expert, part facilitator, part coach, and part cheer leader. I am not an administrator, I am a "boots on the ground" practicing physician. As you may be aware, it can be so difficult to do performance improvement and practice transformation within the busy practice environment, and having a resource to help in this way is crucial to the health care reform effort and the mission of the GMCB, in my humble opinion. I realize that the ACO model is evolving, but I can't imagine a scenario where we will not benefit from having the RCR leadership going forward. I hope that you will consider the potential negative impact that cutting the funding for the RCR role might have on our health care reform progress and ongoing efforts.
