Re: RRMC Window Replacement CoN Jurisdiction Determination

Dear Ms. Jerry:

Rutland Regional Medical Center is planning to start a multi-year window replacement project, which in total will replace 361 windows over the span of three years. We have phased the replacements as three stages with separate workplans and budgets. We have included each of the 3 phases in the four-year plan that was submitted as part of our 2018 Budget. The first phase includes replacement of 152 windows that are located in the 1957 building. We would like to start the 1957 building this summer (2018), it is estimated that it will take a year to complete. The second phase includes replacing 121 windows in the 1977 building. The 1977 phase would begin in 2019. The last part of the project is to replace 88 windows in the 1988 building which would begin in 2020.

I am writing to ask for a determination of jurisdiction under the CoN statute and regulations for this multi-year window replacement project. The windows no longer function properly and are energy inefficient. This is truly a maintenance/replacement project and not a renovation. All windows need to be replaced as none are newer then 1988.

The cost of the window project is as follows:
