Please find enclosed responses to the additional answers to your letter of November 4, 2016.

1.From the CMS' Nursing Home Compare website, provide copies of the current information contained in the tabs titled, General Information, Health and Fire Safety, Staffing including overall staffing and overall RN staffing, Quality Measures, and Penalties.

2.Relative to HRAP Standard 1.6, provide specific detail of how Wake Robin collects and monitors data relating to health care quality and outcomes.

Wake Robin uses data that is submitted to CMS using our MDS submissions and is updated monthly and reported back to us using multiple sources of data. LTC Trend Trackersm is a web-based tool that enables Wake Robin to access key clinical information. This data allows Wake Robin to benchmark personal metrics to those of our peers and to use the data for ongoing quality improvement efforts.

The Abaqis software program enables us to use the facility specific data for the following tasks: identification of the root cause of issues, assist the facility in preparing for surveys and quality monitoring, is a major component of the organizations' foundation for QAPI (Quality Assurance Performance Improvement) actions, tracks and trends hospital readmissions, measures and benchmarks customer satisfaction. This software enables the facility to do deeper analysis of clinical trends and specific auditing of clinical services provided for individual residents or groups.

In addition, the facility has task specific groups that meet regularly to assess specific clinical areas such as weekly skin/wound rounds, weekly falls review, monthly reviews of pharmacy audits and recommendations to list a few.

3. Relative to HRAP Standard 1.7, provide specific detail of how Wake Robin implements evidence-based practices and how practitioners are made aware of evidence-based practice guidelines and how such guidelines are incorporated into decision making.

Wake Robin's health services department participates in many outside initiatives such as Advancing Excellence, OASIS dementia culture change practices, MDRO (Multi drug resistant organism) collaborative that works with the Vermont Department of Health and area hospitals and nursing homes to improve the communication between receiving facilities for residents with potentially contagious infections. This group also collaborates with the infection control practitioners from the hospitals and Health Department to implement best practice approaches for infection control, environmental modifications and environmental approaches to cleaning, care of laundry, precaution techniques etc. The Director of Nursing and the Nurse Educator/Infection Control Nurse work directly with the facility staff in education and updates of new recommendations and care protocols.

The Medicare Quality Innovation Network – Quality Improvement Organization contractor for CT, ME, MA, NH, RI and VT otherwise known as the QIO (Quality Improvement Organization) is also used as a resource and provides the facility with real time ideas, suggestions, protocols and research data for clinical changes. This information is provided through the website, emails, webinars, and conference calls with regional facilities discussing best practices. The consulting QIO Nurse maintains great contact with the DNS of our facility to provide a resource for clinical focus areas. www.HealthCareforNewEngland.org

Large systematic changes in protocols or care delivery methods are reviewed with our Medical Director and any revisions, recommendations are included. Wake Robin has two primary physicians who see the majority of the residents in the health center and they work very collaboratively with the nursing staff to individualize the care being provided. These two physicians also are informed of any new changes and their input is requested. Supporting literature and information is always available. The physicians (2 – 3 currently), for the remaining four residents who do not receive care from the two physicians mentioned above, are informed by nursing staff of any appropriate protocols or care practices in effect in the facility and discussion between nursing and the doctor takes place prior to orders being requested.

The facility is participating in and is in process of implementing the INTERACT system developed by the University of Florida. INTERACT ("Interventions to Reduce Acute Care Transfers") program is intended to provide best practice recommendations and tools for nursing staff with the goal of decreasing/preventing unnecessary resident trips to the acute care setting.

Implementation of systems changes within the clinical area are done using the Quality Assurance Performance Improvement team and/ or smaller focused task groups. Root cause analysis and changes to systems are systematically implemented with information sharing, education and ongoing assessment of results. The formal CQI/QAPI team reviews all studies and data being tracked on at least a quarterly basis.
